Community Impact 2019-2020 Fiscal Year

Our doors remained open this year however, survivors' ability to access services was sadly impacted by COVID-19 and "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" orders.

"DVS has shown me how to live again."

Our **24-hour** support hotline received **3,432** calls from survivors, friends, and family.

Our **52-bed** emergency shelter provided **129** adults and **151** children with a confidential place to stay, equaling **8,822** safe bednights.

The supportive housing department, which transitions survivors from homelessness to permanent housing, provided **42** adults and **72** children with **27,694** bednights.

DVS offers weekly support groups and provided **58** clients with **370** hours of support.

696 children participated in a variety of enrichment activities within DVS programs totaling **1,359** hours of support.

The prevention program attended local schools providing **1,849** students teen dating violence education.

Our legal advocacy department provided **593** families with legal information, education, and support totaling **2,013** hours of advocacy.

We couldn't do it all without volunteers! **164** volunteers contributed **3,965** hours assisting with legal advocacy, housing, fundraising events, shelter, and the New & Again Thrift Shoppe.
